What is sports arbitrage?

Arbitrage betting — often called "arbing" — is when you place bets on **all possible outcomes of a sporting event** using **different bookmakers** that offer **different odds**.


Because of how those odds differ, you can lock in a **small guaranteed profit** no matter who wins.

Example:

- Bookmaker A offers: Arsenal to win @ 2.80
- Bookmaker B offers: Arsenal to lose or draw @ 2.20

In the example you are covering all outcomes, as Arsenal can only loose, win or draw.

If you split your stakes correctly, you'll make around 23% profit — risk-free.



Is it legal?

Arbitrage in sports betting is completely **legal in the UK and most countries** where sports betting itself is legal.

You're not manipulating results or exploiting a glitch — you're simply taking advantage of differences between bookmakers' odds.

Bookmakers set their prices independently, and sometimes they disagree.

Sideflo just finds those moments — automatically.

Arbitrage its self is a mathematical concept that is applied in all financial markets. Sports betting is just one of them.

Think of it like:

Buying an iPhone for £700 in one shop and selling it for £720 in another — you're not breaking any rules, just using pricing inefficiencies.

One small caveat, is that you might eventually get limited by the sports book when you start winning too much.

Getting started

All you need to do is find the right matches, markets, calculate the odds and place the bets.

- 1. Scans live odds from multiple UK bookmakers in real time.
- 2. **Detects discrepancies** where you can profit from the difference.
- 3. Shows you exactly what to bet on and how much to stake using a built-in calculator.

All you need to do is create accounts with at least 2 sports books. Main ones are:

• Bet365, PaddyPower, Betfred, Unibet, SkyBet
